  - All uses excluding: dwelling units and common areas of flats (1.6), shopping centres (1.7), small premises (1.8), Note: Hospitals and sports grounds - out of scope
  - Storey exits in industrial, storage and office buildings
  - Single escape route
    - Residential (care facility) 20
    - Day Centre (crèche, pre-school, day nursery) 20
    - School, all other uses 60

- Design for Horizontal escape (1.4)
  - Care Facilities
    - Door closing devices
    - Walls between bedrooms
    - No of bed spaces in a compartment


